

## Light Horse Selection Project & Record Book 4-H 175 Including Equine Record Book Guidelines190R

As an Advisor, Parent, Project Helper or Judge this list will be useful in ensuring each member finishes required records and book work and prepares the child for judging, and culminates in being able to show at the Logan County Fair. This project is for the Intermediate Level Member of at least 13 years of age.

As a first year member in this Light Horse Selection project the following books will be necessary to complete the project and will then be used for all of the levels listed above. Light Horse Selection Project & Record Book 4-H 175, Uniform Rules for 4-H Horse Show 4-H 179, & Equine Record Book 4-H 190R. Horses, Safety and You 4-H 191R is also required reference for all levels of Horse Projects. Books can be used multiple years with added inserts for repeatable activities. 	<b>Balance</b> (Pgs. 5 & 6) Explore all 7 activities. Choose & Complete 4 including: List 7 ways to determine balance in judging halter classes, and Identify the parts of the horse on a drawing and on a live horse. These will require the usage and reading of pages 11-18.
	<b>Structural Correctness</b> (Pg. 6) Explore all 5. Choose & Complete 3 including: <i>Draw or display five pictures of structural defects that may cause unsoundness.</i> These will require the usages and reading of pages 18-26.
	<b>Way of Going</b> (Pg. 6) Explore all 4. Choose & Complete 3 including: <i>List and explain the six features of the stride.</i> These will require the usages and reading of page 27.
	<b>Type</b> (Pg.6) Explore all 5. Choose & Complete 3 including: <i>Display</i> and identify pictures of 5-10 different breeds of horses and list their breed characteristics. These will require the usage and reading of pages 28-37.
	<b>System of Examination Halter Classes</b> (Pg. 6) Explore all 4. Choose and complete 3 pick including: <i>List important factors to examine at front, side and rear views.</i> These will require the usage and reading of pages 38-39
	<b>Judging Pleasure Performance Classes</b> (Pg. 6) Explore all 4. Choose & complete 3 including pick 3 List and explain the five factors in judging pleasure classes. These will require the usage and reading of pages 40 & 41.
	<b>Basic Horse Colors</b> (pg. 6) Explore and complete all 3. These will require the usage and reading of page 42.
	Oral Reasons (Pg. 6) Explore all 7. Choose & complete 4 including: Develop your own sample set of notes for oral reasons, and (*Senior Members also need to complete Write a set of notes and give a sample set of reasons. mandatory activities.)* These will require the usage and reading of pages 43-47.
