### GENERAL GUIDELINES

1. The participants of this project will be split into six classes:
  - Cake Decorating, Beginner, Junior (age 13 and younger)
  - Cake Decorating, Beginner, Senior (age 14 or older)
  - Cake Decorating, Intermediate, Junior (age 13 and younger)
  - Cake Decorating, Intermediate, Senior (age 14 or older)
  - Cake Decorating, Advanced, Junior (age 13 and younger)
  - Cake Decorating, Advanced, Senior (age 14 or older)
2. Type of Evaluation:
  - All participants will have a personal interview evaluation with a judge.
  - All participants will complete a hands-on skill evaluation. This may be on piping, creation of decorations (stars, dots, rosette, zigzag), lettering, etc. The evaluation will be based on the skill level of the participant (beginner, intermediate, advanced) not age.
  - Judges will evaluate participants on the following:
    - Quality of Oral Presentation
    - Overall Appearance of Display
    - Quality of Display
    - Skill Evaluation
    - Project Analysis (project book completion and records)
3. Participant to bring:
  - Completed project book
  - One decorated cake/cupcake made as a part of your 4-H project to use during the interview with the judge to show how well you can apply the skills taught in your project area.
  - Cake Decorating participants may decorate an actual cake, cupcake, or may use a Styrofoam base for the cake decorated.

- Skills used on cakes should only be those in the current and previous checklist that the participant is completing.
  - Cakes may not exceed 4 tiers.
  - Cakes must be carried into the judging area by the 4-H member. No carts, wagons or other transportation devices may be used to bring the cake to the judging area.
  - Participants must also bring a display as per the project requirements, which represents their learning experience. The display does not need to be a tri-fold display board. If the display is something other than a poster, it must be limited in size to what the participant can handle/maneuver on his or her own (no wagons).
4. Project Display at Junior Fair:
- Projects may be displayed as part of your 4-H Club's Booth in the 4-H Building or as another Junior Fair Entry.
  - The 4-H'er may choose what is exhibited in the Junior Fair Booth.
  - Booth Setup is Friday, July 5<sup>th</sup>, 5:00 – 9:00pm and Saturday July 6<sup>th</sup>, 8:00am – 2:00pm. All booths need to be completed by 2:00pm on Saturday July 6<sup>th</sup>.
  - The 4-H'er may take what they need from the booth for judging and return it back to the booth when done with judging.
  - Booth Removal is on Sunday, July 14<sup>th</sup>, 8:00am – 5:00pm. All items needed to be removed Sunday, any items past 5:00pm will be discarded.
5. Awards & State Competitions
- Awards for this category will be announced and presented at the Awards Presentation Thursday, July 11<sup>th</sup>, 4:00pm in the Activity Building at the Fairgrounds.
  - The following projects DO have the opportunity to display at the Ohio State Fair for 2019:
