GENERAL GUIDELINES

1. Along with judging all clothing projects will participate in the Fashion Review at the Fairgrounds (Activity Building) on Tuesday, July 9th, at 7pm. Please arrive by 6:30pm.
2. 4-H'ers who take more than one clothing project must complete separate learning experiences related to each, including creating a separate, complete, total look outfit FOR EACH PROJECT. (ex. A top made for one project cannot be used in another project; an outfit used in one project cannot be used with an Outerwear project.)
3. Age of Participants:
 - Please note ages under specific project classes below.
4. Type of Evaluation:
 - Participants will take part in the project judging and have an interview with a judge. Judges will evaluate knowledge, skill and understanding related to the project.
 - Participants should be dressed in the outfit they made or assembled according to the guidelines and information in their project book.
5. Participant to bring:
 1. Completed Project Book.
 2. Clothing Patterns
 3. Complete and "total look" (accessories, shoes, etc., to complete the outfit). The participant should be wearing their project.
 4. Items listed below for each project.

6. Project Display at Junior Fair:

- Projects may be displayed as part of your 4-H Club's Booth in the 4-H Building or as another Junior Fair Entry.
- The 4-H'er may choose what is exhibited in the Junior Fair Booth.
- Booth Setup is Friday, July 5th, 5:00 – 9:00pm and Saturday July 6th, 8:00am – 2:00pm. All booths need to be completed by 2:00pm on Saturday July 6th.
- The 4-H'er may take what they need from the booth for judging and return it back to the booth when done with judging.
- Booth Removal is on Sunday, July 14th, 8:00am – 5:00pm. All items needed to be removed Sunday, any items past 5:00pm will be discarded.

7. Awards & State Competitions

- Awards for this category will be announced and presented at the Style Review Tuesday, July 9th, in the Activity Building at the Fairgrounds following the Style Review.

Projects are Listed by Skill Level***

Beginning-Level Projects

407 Accessories for Teens

- All participants will be in one class:
 - 4-H Age 8 and over
- Wear at least one accessory you made with the outfit for which it was designed.

409 Sew Fun

- Participants will be split into two classes:
 1. Junior – (4-H Age 13 and under)
 2. Senior – (4-H Age 14 and over)
- Members are to make a total of 2 items for this project. One pin cushion and one item from an “easy” or “beginner” pattern.
- County guidelines:
 - A. Waist options - 5 options
 1. A simple fold-down casing with elastic can be used.
 2. Some patterns call for a separate waistband that is sewn on top of the skirt and then the elastic is threaded into the casing. This is also acceptable.
 3. Some fashions are still showing 2 or 3 tiers of 1/4" elastic being used in waistbands. This is acceptable for the skirt.
 4. Bias tape used as the turndown on the waistband if pattern calls for it is acceptable.
 5. Half elastic (in back) and half flat band (in front) is acceptable. This is a more flattering treatment for some members.
 - B. Hem - Hand or machine hem.
 - C. No ruffles or tiered skirts.
 - D. Pockets
 1. A simple patch pocket; rounded or square corners, machine or hand stitched, can be added.
 2. A side seam pocket can be used if it is cut and sewn as part of the skirt.
 3. Can also be a separate pocket sewn in side seam.
 - E. Trim - Simple applique can be used or can use buttons as an embellishment.
 - F. Zippers – no zippers are permitted in beginner level projects
- Evaluation Criteria:
 - Ability to sew straight seams.
 - Make an elastic casing.
 - Finish seams with appropriate seam finish.
- If a hand hem is not on the completed garment complete the following:
 - Make a hem sample 24" in length. Suggest using a 6"x 12" piece of fabric, turn up 1/4" and then 2 inches for a 2" hem. Any scrap of cotton or cotton/polyester fabric can be used. This hem sample needs to be brought to project evaluation.
- No sergers or knit fabrics.

410 Designed by Me

- All participants will be in one class:
 - 4-H Age 8 and over
- Wear your decorated top (with the 2 embellishment methods you used) with the completed outfit you assembled for a total look.

413 Sundresses and Jumpers

- All participants will be in one class:
 - 4-H Age 8 and over
- Wear the sundress or jumper you constructed with accessories for the total look.

419 Terrific Tops

- All participants will be in one class:
 - 4-H Age 8 and over
- Wear the top you constructed with accessories for the total look.

Intermediate-Level Projects

411 em-bel-lish: A 4-H Guide to Wearable Art

- All participants will be in one class:
 - 4-H Age 8 and over
- Bring the previously made garment or ready-to-wear garment selected from your wardrobe or a ready to-wear garment that you embellished. Select other garments and accessories for a total look outfit. Bring completed activities, Talking it Over pages and completed notebook with at least 3 samples of embellishment techniques you tried, including the technique you used on the garment you selected.

412 Sew for Others

- Participants will be split into two classes:
 - Junior – (4-H Age 13 and under)
 - Senior – (4-H Age 14 and over)
- It is desirable, but not required, for the “other” to be present to show an outfit you made at the judging and Fashion Revue. If the other cannot be present, simply bring the garment you made to show the judge and to exhibit in the Fashion Revue. We limit the number of “others” and outfits to no more than one “other” outfit per entrant. Choose one outfit that best represents your work to bring to judging. (If the project is repeated for multiple years, a new category of “other” must be selected.)
- You may sew for another person in one of five categories:
 1. Infants, Toddlers and Children
 2. Pre-Teens, Teens and Adults
 3. Older Adults,
 4. Physically Handicapped or Disabled
 5. Special Activities.

415 Ready, Set, Sew Active!

- All participants will be in one class:
 - 4-H Age 8 and over
- Wear the garment you constructed for active sports.

418 Loungewear

- All participants will be in one class:
 - 4-H Age 8 and over
- Construct the outer layer of a lounging outfit such as a robe, shawl or cover-up. Make or select other garments and accessories (sleepwear and footwear) to complete your outfit.

424 Clothing for Middle School

- All participants will be in one class:
 - 4-H Age 8 and over
- Wear the garment you constructed (garment with sleeves or a skirt or pants plus a top) along with assembled outfit and accessories for the total look to wear to school.

430 Shopping Savvy

- Participants will be split into two classes:
 - Junior – (4-H Age 13 and under)
 - Senior – (4-H Age 14 and over)
- Wear a total look outfit assembled according to the information in your project to convey the image you wish to project to the audience and judges. However, you will be judged on mastery of the project book rather than the outfit worn unless the outfit was put together to complete an activity within the project.

Advanced-Level Projects

406 Clothes for High School and College

- All participants will be in one class:
 - 4-H Age 8 and over
- Wear the garment you constructed (minimum of two pieces or a one-piece garment with sleeves plus some other style detail not tried before).

408 Creative Costumes

- All participants will be in one class:
 - 4-H Age 8 and over
- Wear the costume you made for yourself. You will be judged on the mastery of the project book in addition to the garment constructed. (If the project is repeated for multiple years, a new costume category must be selected.)

417 Dress-Up Outfit

- All participants will be in one class:
 - 4-H Age 8 and over
- Wear the dress-up garment you constructed for formal wear and accessories for the total look.

420 Outerwear for Anywhere

- All participants will be in one class:
 - 4-H Age 8 and over
- Wear outer garment constructed and accessories for the total look. Outfit components may not be used in another state fair clothing project.

425 Look Great for Less

- Participants will be split into two classes:
 - Junior – (4-H Age 13 and under)
 - Senior – (4-H Age 14 and over)
- Wear the “total look” outfit you put together as inexpensively as possible. The total look includes clothing, accessories, jewelry, shoes, etc. It is acceptable to use an item or two from those you already own, but remember this is a shopping project and the majority of your total look should be items purchased using skills you’ve learned while doing this project.

426 Clothing for Your Career

- All participants will be in one class:
 - 4-H Age 8 and over
- Wear the outfit you made. The outfit should have at least 2 pieces, appropriate for the job, work or an interview (suit, uniform or work outfit).

432M Sewing and Textiles (non-Clothing Master)

- This project does not go to State Fair.
- All participants will be in one class:
 - 4-H Age 8 and over
