GENERAL GUIDELINES

1. Age of Participants:

- Please note ages under specific project classes below.
- Participants in Shooting Sports Projects must have been at least 9 years old as of January 1 of the current year according to Ohio 4-H Shooting Sports policy.
- Safe Use of Guns and Basic Archery may be ages 8-18

2. Type of Evaluation:

- Participants have a personal interview evaluation with a judge.
- The judge evaluates each participant on the following basis:
 - 30% Knowledge (Basic concepts learned in the project)
 - 20% Communication (Presentation of the project)
 - 20% Project book
 - 20% Project Display (Quality)
 - 10% Leadership/Citizenship

3. Participant to bring:

- Completed project book. A certified Shooting Sports Instructor must sign the cover of the member record book to be eligible to compete in 4-H Shooting Sports (Projects 750, 751, 752, 753, 754, 755, 756 and 757).
- A display representing the learning experience of the current project. Because of space limitations, each participant removes his or her display from the judging area when the interview is complete.
- Guns, bows, arrows, ammunition, and firearms of any kind are not permitted on property. Participants may not use any of these items or three-dimensional replicas of these items as a part of any display. Displays also may not include any part of an arrow longer than 6 inches. Displays may not include any 'loaded' ammunition. Any shells or casings must be open so that

a visual examination can show that there is no powder in ammunition (the caps must be either absent or expended).

- Wild bird feathers, except legal game species, and all bird nests and eggs are protected under state and federal laws and are not permitted to be collected, possessed, or presented as a part of any display.
4. Project Display at Junior Fair:
- Projects may be displayed as part of your 4-H Club's Booth in the 4-H Building or as another Junior Fair Entry.
 - The 4-H'er may choose what is exhibited in the Junior Fair Booth.
 - Booth Setup is Friday, July 5th, 5:00 – 9:00pm and Saturday July 6th, 8:00am – 2:00pm. All booths need to be completed by 2:00pm on Saturday July 6th.
 - The 4-H'er may take what they need from the booth for judging and return it back to the booth when done with judging.
 - Booth Removal is on Sunday, July 14th, 8:00am – 5:00pm. All items needed to be removed Sunday, any items past 5:00pm will be discarded.
5. Awards & State Competitions
- Awards for this category will be announced and presented at the Awards Presentation Thursday, July 11th, 4:00pm in the Activity Building at the Fairgrounds.
